Dear Friends through Christ:

This particular corona virus has been a formidable foe, especially for the church. Covid-19 has chased away over half the people from worship in one single year, and the Delta Variant has kept them from returning. Just a few months ago,

I felt this form of evil was slowly winding down, but it has reared its ugly head again, causing us to make changes on the fly. Our original goal of combining the two worship services into one, with Sunday morning Bible study and choir have been postponed from early September to a "wait and see what this thing does" date. We have our work cut out for us.

Twenty years ago, 70% of Americans claimed they belonged to a church, synagogue or mosque. In the year 2019, the number of Americans claiming to have a church home dropped to 47%. Using 325,000,000 as our population, that means, the church has lost 74,800,000 saints and sinners in the past twenty years. And this is a number before the pandemic! Factor in the virus, and one can add another 76,350,000, or 50% of self-proclaiming Christians leaving the church this past year alone. Will they return? Your guess is as good as mine.

What does all this mean? It means less than 25% of the population of the United States of America will be attending worship this coming Sunday. Again, Peace has her work cut out. We cannot return to yesteryear, but we can do something, and we'd better start doing it sooner rather than later.

I do not enjoy being the bearer of a grim news. But it doesn't have to be this way. With Christ Jesus in our hearts, we begin to understand what the Apostle Paul writes in Roman 8:28, "For we know that all things work together for good for those who love God." With 75% of the U.S. population being either un-churched or de-churched the harvest is definitely plentiful. I trust that God will work through our efforts to rebuild this glorious house of worship.

We have worked hard the past couple of years getting our church facility functional and looking great. Thank-you for that support! We have a beautiful worship service, especially for the baby boomers and older, who happen to be the largest group of people claiming they plan to return to church when the pandemic is behind us, and a large percentage of these claim they are open to a new place of worship.

So how do we begin to reach at least a small portion of the 250,000,000 people who feel the worship of God is no longer important?

Did you know that "word of mouth" is the most effective way to grow a business or a church? More effective than all other forms of advertising combined! Word of mouth truly works. But a person must use their mouth in order for the best form of advertising to work. We can no longer assume most of the people we know already have a church and are happy there.

What about this? Start making a list of the people you care about the most. When you feel the time is right, simply ask, "Do you have a church home?" If they answer, "No," then simply say to them "Come and See." When this virus gets behind us (and it will) invite everyone on that list. It's a start. More people walk through the doors of a church because someone they knew invited them. The harvest is plentiful.

The second most effective form of advertising is signage. During the sale of the property, the buyer shared with me last year's traffic count of cars that pass our property. On the average, 11,490 cars pass Peace Lutheran Church, daily. Our current sign is old and for the most part unreadable. I can envision a beautiful sign allowing over 10,000 people a day, who are living and working close to Peace Church, to see us. Our neighbors will always know what is happening inside, day after day, week after week. If the new sign brings in only one person per month, the sign would pay for herself in around three years. There are pictures of what I have in mind in the narthex. The harvest is plentiful.

An example of how God works through all things can be seen in the church's online presence. The virus forced us to figure out how our parishioners might hear the gospel during our two month shutdown. Now our postings are viewed by approximately 350 people per week. I will continue to share the message on Facebook. Perhaps when we begin to host events, our hard work will pay off.

Speaking of events, I can also picture a beautiful shelter house in our court yard, hosting all kinds of events and ministries. Saturday evening worship service has always done well at the previous churches I've served, but I have always felt an outdoor worship under cover will reach even more of the younger crowd, those wanting something not so churchy and those who work on Sunday. The picnic shelter can host all kind of things like community potlucks, ice cream socials, craft shows, car shows, blessing of the animals, multiple outdoor classes, or rented to our friends and neighbors for celebrations. Pictures of this vision are also in the narthex. The harvest is plentiful.

Yes I know, times are a little tough right now, but like I said, trust that God will work through our efforts to rebuild this glorious house of worship. Thank you for allowing me to share my thoughts and visions.

As I compose this Olive Branch article, I'm winding down from a week with family in Nebraska. What a transition: from palm trees and sandy beaches to deep green fields of corn and soybeans. We enjoyed cool, dry mornings and evenings; visits to the Homestead National Historical Monument in Beatrice and Offutt AFB. We drove northeast from Omaha along the Elkhorn River, past fields, feedlots, small farming towns and Norfolk, Nebraska: a city of 20,000 souls with seven Lutheran churches! I always return from visits to the Heartland with a deep appreciation for the vastness of the Great Plains, the down-to-earth values of its residents and the ubiquitous churches they've built to worship our Lord.

Despite the differences between eastern Nebraska and the Space Coast, many of the challenges we face are the same. Covid infection/vaccination rates; masking policies at public and private institutions—especially schools. Fully re-opening restaurants and other businesses. Preparation for the imminent college football season dominate the sports pages in both locales, only it's "Cornhuskers" there and "Gators", "Seminoles", "Hurricanes" and "Knights" here.

As we drove through Offutt AFB, my thoughts turned to my time in the USAF and an old adage we would use on those frequent occasions when things went awry and plans/expectations changed: "Flexibility is the key to air power." Fast forward to 2021 and Palm Bay, FL: we've been planning a launch date for PLC's emergence from 18 months of lockdowns, masks, and social distancing: a great leap forward to combined Sunday services, bible studies, small group gatherings and, yes!!---church potlucks! We've had to put that great leap on hold; but we're ready.

Our timetable may be flexible, but our faith is unchanging and rock solid. Praise God!

Treasurer's Report

As of the end of July, we are now under budget in contributions by \$15,449.09 for the year (that's not good). We are also under budget in expenses by \$6,851.61 (that's good). July expenses were high mainly because there were three payrolls in that month. This happens twice a year.

In the June newsletter I reported that COVID-19 was slowing down. Unfortunately, that is not the case. Some of us are wearing masks, most are vaccinated and we're all praying that we see the end of this virus soon.

Our attendance is low on Sundays which is very sad because Pastor David together with the Holy Spirit are giving us five-star sermons. I've belonged to 10 Lutheran churches and visited some other denominations and Pastor David sermons are up there with the best. If you are missing these in person or through the website, I sincerely hope you are being fed spiritually. We do miss all that have decided that it's not safe to attend church or are worshipping elsewhere.

Our noisy offering is going to different good causes each month. The June noisy offering raised \$205.50 for the Food Pantry which is helping to supplement those in our area with canned food, fresh vegetables, and meat. For the July noisy offering we raised \$165.50 for our Calling and Caring Committee that visit shut-ins and those in hospitals and nursing homes. In August we are raising monies for Family Promise of Brevard which helps families with minor children. During September we will raise monies for ELCA Seminary.

Please keep Peace Lutheran Church in your prayers. Please have a safe and healthy September.

CDC Guidance for Faith Based Organizations

PLC leadership continues to follow the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidance for faith based organizations. The most recent CDC guidance simply says: "Infection/ transmission is minimal for fully vaccinated people; prevention measures are still recommended for unvaccinated people, including wearing masks, staying 6 feet apart from people who don't live with you, avoiding crowds and washing hands often."



Most PLC worshippers are fully vaccinated; others are not. We are blessed with plenty of space in our sanctuary for attendees to do what is comfortable for them as far as masking and distancing.

Thanks to all for your dedication to Christ and devotion to PLC!

- Maintain good hand hygiene, washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, tissues, and no-touch trash cans. (We have hand sanitizer readily available for your use)
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or use the inside of your elbow. Throw used tissues in a no-touch trash can.
- Face coverings are meant to protect other people in case the wearer is unknowingly infected but does not have symptoms.
- Do not place protective masks on anyone who has trouble breathing or is unconscious, or anyone who is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.




The idea is to spread the Love of God and the stories of the Bible through short entertaining messages over the phone.


