A man fell from the top of the Empire State Building, as he plunged 102 stories a young woman on the 50th floor yelled out to the man as he came flying by, "Hey, how's it going." The man replied, "So far so good!"

PASTOR'S DESK 2019 was my first full year as your pastor and "So far so good." We have accomplished a great deal in the Lampstand called Peace Lutheran Church in our first full year together. Our grounds are looking good. The breeze-

way by the offices have been painted and doors on fellowship hall. Thank you those who put many days into this project and also thank you to all who take part in "Adopt a Plot," yet remember adoption is ongoing.

We completed the remodel of Peace Place in 2019 and it is beautiful. Originally our thought process was to use Peace Place as an event center for parties and weddings. However, the opportunity arose to rent the space to "In Seasons Ministries" for worship. So for one year (2020) they will pay \$1400 per month to worship here, and they seem to treat Peace Place with reverence. We will revisit the possibility as an event center toward the end of this year.

Another section of our complex (the space next to the food pantry) for most of 2019 was rented to Holistic Health Center for \$750 per month, but just this month they informed me it wasn't working out the way they hoped. It is a lovely space with reception area, bathroom and four offices. It is perfect for a small company that does not need a lot of foot traffic—sort of hidden. So if anybody knows of a good fit, just call me.

We also replaced the carpet in the sanctuary and it looks great, along with a new sound system and it sounds great. To top that off in two short weeks we raised enough funds to replace the air condition unit in the sanctuary at a cost of \$16,000. Now we worship in a beautiful space, we can hear, and we are not too cold or hot. I realize our comfort and the beauty of our church is not the top priority of Christ, but in our world how ones takes care of His Church reflects directly to our commitment to the gospel.

The top priority of the Church is Word and Sacrament! The proclamation of Scripture through preaching and teaching, the administration of God's mysteries of Holy Baptism and Holy Communion will change lives and situations to the point where we begin to think more about the needs of others. Here too Peace has done a pretty good job. We open our property to all kinds of wonderful ministries. We now have two churches worshipping at Peace, food pantry, Meals on Wheels, Weight Watchers, AA, NA, Youth Group, and many other occasional groups. We have also seen a slight uptick in giving and attendance from last year, even brought in 15 new members.

Like I said, "So far so good!" Yet there is so much more to be done and I believe so much potential lies within these sacred walls. We just need to continue to focus upon Word and Sacrament and know in our hearts and minds that when this journey ends there is a huge safety net called Jesus that will save us with His loving arms.

# The Christian League Youth Group (CLYG)

"A bridge to Jesus for our youth in the community"



#### Beloved of God,

Our Christian League Youth Group (CLYG) is busy tackling barriers or boundaries during this Season of Light, a season we are called to follow Christ beyond our personal or corporate entrenchments. To remind us how difficult this can be, as February begins, we're reminded of the story of Jesus' sermon in this hometown of Nazareth. At first, the community seems to welcome his message, proclaiming liberty to captives and letting the oppressed go free sounds perfectly fine to them. But the ensuing conversation devolves into an argument about insiders and outsiders and the next thing you know, the hometown crowd is ready to throw Jesus over the cliff.

St. Paul, who planted many congregations throughout the Mediterranean world and who struggled to help them grasp the implications of being grafted into Christ, spoke powerfully about the importance of reconciliation, which at its heart is about breaking down barriers so relationships can be restored. In Ephesians he writes: "For Christ is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups (Jew and Gentile) into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us." And in 2 Corinthians Paul testifies to the God "who reconciled us to himself through Christ and has given us the ministry of reconciliation."

A good deal of the opposition Jesus experienced in his ministry, including in his hometown, had to do with how he pushed the presumed boundaries of God's circle of care outward, so that it encompassed those whom law and tradition had looked away from or blocked from the desire to truly see. When at his crucifixion the curtains of the Temple are torn in two from top to bottom, the last divide between God and humanity is breached. But we human beings are good at building and maintaining barriers. Yet, however much we find ourselves tilting toward the task of erecting or reinforcing barriers that divide, Jesus shows us not to mindlessly accept the convention of accepting divisions amongst us, but to bend will and body instead to the task of their dismantling.

These barriers or boundaries we establish, not just amongst each other but inside ourselves, are the topics we're discussing this month. Join us to explore the subjects that concerns youth today, that this CLYG has asked about, and how His Word guides us to make choices that see barriers and boundaries for what they are for us. We're looking and talking about subjects like drugs, friends, neighbors, dating, attitudes, values, fear, gossip, school, bullying, and volunteering, to name just a few, where we very well see and hear "the dividing," "the hostility between us," and how we can reconcile every inert challenge in His peace, His hope, and His love.
