



Dear Friends through Christ:

A couple of weeks ago Peace Lutheran and twenty or so volunteers, hosted Vacation Bible School, VBS. Our task? To make known the Gospel to about 50 neighborhood children ages four to twelve, for five days in a row. Daunting, to say the least, but with the help of the Holy Spirit and others, Peace Lutheran pulled off the impossible. We not only taught these young ones the Love of God and Love of Others, we showed these miniature saints and sinners a wonderful week of fun and laughter. The kids look forward to VBS each and every year! Thank you to all who volunteered their time and their treasure to make this worthwhile ministry possible.

I say worthwhile, because some feel that the parents use VBS to farm off the children in the summer, you know, give them something to do and get them out of the house for an entire morning. And that's Ok. Because we are planting valuable seeds that can grow in that young mind at any time. I've seen it. Here they learn they are Loved! Plus, little people ask some of the best questions. On the very first day, when we were talking about all the miraculous birth of Jesus, this adorable little eight-year-old asked, "Well, what's the point?" Great question! And if the church doesn't try to answer their questions, who will?

On the last day of VBS, we served up pizzas to all the kids and family. Here I met the father of one the young students. He happened to serve on the board or council of the congregation that he attended, and this man was totally impressed with our sanctuary. He also mentioned, his congregation was looking for a new place that can worship about 65 French speaking Seven Day Adventist Church people.

Wait a minute, don't Seven Day Adventist worship on Saturday? Yes, they do. I was also informed that his church usually finishes worship around 3PM, and I don't start Saturday worship till 5PM. Why can't The Shekinah French Church of Palm Bay SDA start worshipping at Peace Lutheran on Saturday? We're not using it. The council says that is fine. So starting on August 9, 2025, about 65 French speaking Seven Day Adventist will be worshipping at Peace Lutheran. Our task? Their task? To make known the gospel. Plus, opening up our facilities to worship will generate \$12,000 worth of income, which is always needed.

The Seventh-day Adventist are one of the newer Christian denominations, formed just over 150 years ago in 1863. As of 2016, it is one of the fastest growing and most widespread churches worldwide, with a baptized membership of over 22 million people. For the most part Seventh-day Adventist believe the same about God, Christ Jesus, and the Holy Spirit as Lutherans do, except they believe we should continue to worship on the Sabbath, the day of rest, the seventh day of week, Saturday. After all, Jesus worshipped from Friday night to Saturday and never told us to change that? (Just thinking out loud)
