

Dear Friend through Christ Jesus:

It dealt with all the things we desired to accomplish in the near future. Now I feel like we're living in a dream and who knows what our community or our world will look like when we finally wake up.

How long will it be till I can go and watch the Chicago Bears play any of the Florida teams? How long will I be wearing this stupid mask and walking the wrong way down the grocery aisle? When can we go out and eat with family and friends at our favorite restaurant? When can we visit the sick and shut-in? But the one that could drive me crazy, if I let it...is when can we worship together as the Family of God and what will that worship look like?

So many questions and truthfully no solid answers.

Focus on Romans 8:28, "God works through all things for the good of those who love him."

I realize our governor has never officially closed the churches and for some states, including Florida, they are targeting a May 1st as a date for reopening. For Peace Lutheran, I feel this date is risky. We do have an older population and I'm not certain we have the confidence to venture out. Personally, I would like to wait at least until May 17th, and see what happens when others rush to our new normal and prayerfully, we don't see a spike in this wicked virus that seems to spread so quickly with so much ease. I do not want to take the chance of one single saint and sinners getting sick because we are in a big hurry or too stubborn to heed advice of the medical community.

We will open with two services, 9 & 11, so we can spread out. Peace will continue with online worship for those who are not yet comfortable getting out.

Right now, **Jacqui (Administration), Faye Schill (Treasurer), Tom Accola (President), Lori Search (Social Ministry)** have all been working hard to make sure Peace remains operational. A huge thank you to these saints. Tom and I have been recording the Sunday messages, trying our best to make our worship as enjoyable and meaningful with the resources available.

While being locked behind closed doors, like the disciples, I have tried to speak with most of our members, checking on their well-being and hoping to get to know most you a little better. Quite interesting.

God does work through all things for the good of those who love him!

The week following Easter I shared a message where Jesus came to the disciples behind locked doors out of fear and His first words to them was "Peace be with you!" His second words were "Peace be with you!" When Jesus finally saw Doubting Thomas His first words to Thomas were, "Peace be with you!" I would like to share again briefly how this beautiful text becomes alive today.

As I mention at the beginning of the letter, this month was strange.

There is of course the virus, forcing us to worship via internet. I could spend my time worrying about all of you, or panicking over the church's finances, but I don't.

Then on March 24<sup>th</sup> I dropped off my only son, Noah at Parrish Hospital because he could not breathe. First thought was the virus, and while it was not, he did flirt with death. Sandy did not see Noah for the next two weeks. Sandy and I could have freaked out, but we didn't.

Because of the nature of Noah's illness, Sandy was sent home from UCF and both of us were tested. As we waited a week for the results, we could have been eaten up with anxiety, but that was not the case.

About the same time Noah entered the hospital, Sandy's mother, Pat was admitted to different hospital outside Chicago with a weird kidney disease and a horrible predicted outcome. Again, Sandy and I, mostly Sandy could have fallen apart, but we did not.

Why?

Sandy and I are learning through our journey that so much of what happens in life is totally out of our control. There is nothing I can do about the virus, Noah, testing, or Pat, so why in the world should we allow these unexpected events to worry, panic, freak out, cause anxiety, or fall apart, especially since we can't control the situations? After all, so much of our existence is totally in God's hands, and folks that is a whole lot better than being in my hands, because I will screw stuff up.

He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!

However, there are things I can and should do, like call and check on as many parishioners as I can. I can learn how to record our messages and do the best I can, so we at least are blanketed with God's Word. I can and must drop down to my knees in prayer and pray my heart out. I can read and study Scripture during this down time.

When I let go and let God take over, when I do the things I can and must do, then the Risen Christ comes into our home and says, "Peace be with you!"

Our parishioners seem to be good; our church finances aren't horrible (don't forget to donate); Noah came home Easter Sunday; we tested negative for the virus and my mother-in-law is miraculously doing good on an experimental drug. No worry, no panic, No freaking out. No anxiety. No falling apart.

The Risen Christ comes into our home and gives us Peace.

I hope and pray He does the same for you!

These are challenging times for our world, our nation, our community, and our church! Pastor David installed a dedicated and enthusiastic new council as we met Saturday (with elaborate precautions for social distancing). Our first major decision was to suspend services temporarily: we then went to work on how to keep our worshippers in the loop during the national emergency. We even established some longer term goals: how do we grow PLC into a more welcoming and outward-looking church?

You've already seen the short term results: services and sermons on our Facebook page and website; email updates and phone calls to each PLC worshipper. Please keep your tithes and offerings coming! We're OK for now (see Treasurer's update), but that will quickly change if the funds that keep our church staff and property going dry up. Stay in the loop by frequently checking our PLC website and Facebook page (for those with internet service). Call Pastor David, myself or any council member with any needs or concerns.

The COVID-19 crisis comes at a watershed moment in PLC history: we will awaken to a much-changed world when the crisis ends. We must be prepared for a new beginning; the future of our beloved church will be determined by our actions during the coming weeks and months. We have so much to offer a community that will emerge from this crisis in great need of active faith.

I close with two 'asks':

- Remain open to new ways of doing business as we explore the role of PLC in a 21st Century Lutheran Church. Food and shelter needs are increasing; social norms are shifting and family cohesion is falling; how do we best make our Christian faith relevant in this new environment?
- Take care of yourself and be considerate of those around you! Be reasonable. Be realistic. Be responsible.

### FOOD PANTRY ALTERNATIVE



Our Food Pantry opened on Tuesday, April 28th, and for now, we will only open on Tuesday mornings, from 9am -11am. In addition, ALL Brevard school children to age 18, are now able to pick up bags of food at several neighborhood school locations, Monday—Friday, 10:30-1:30pm. They simply pull up, pop the trunk and the bags are placed inside with friendly familiar smiles and greetings, no questions asked. They are given 2 Breakfasts and 2 lunches for each child in the car and they can go back each day of the week for the same for as long as school remains out. Each bag includes fresh fruit, milk, cheese, cereal, peanut butter, cups of fruit and applesauce, yogurt, etc.... enough for 4 meals. I imagine some families will also make the rounds to several schools.

My 3 year old grandson got his bags today and when he unpacked them he was all smiles. It was something familiar from each day at school that he recognized. My daughter took pictures of him with his smiles and his food. It was quite a bit. Enough for weekends too.

Lori Search from our PLC Council, has been able to get meat and non-perishable foods for our pantry...but in the meantime, many of the children that we will be serving, will be getting good food as well at the schools...considering that they only come one time a month to us for whatever we might have.

So....the children are being fed!

## Treasurer's Report

Dear Members and Friends of Peace Lutheran Church,

Someone recently asked me what we had done to make God so angry with us (COVID-19). I don't think He's angry at Peace Lutheran or the world, but he is trying to get our attention. Maybe He wants us to realize what is important; worshipping our Triune God, being with our loved ones, communing with our church family, and taking care of those around us.

It looks like we are doing well financially at the end of March. Unfortunately in May, Peace will have the beginning of our property taxes due. Last year we made a large payment of \$2,786.44 in May and 11 payments monthly of \$1,173.18. I anticipate that it will be about a similar amount again.

I am happy to report, members have stepped up to the challenge of not meeting weekly. Most of you have made sure your offering is counted either by mailing your check (someone always picks up the mail at the church office), dropping it off to the church on Monday morning, paying through your bank or by using the donation arrow on our Facebook page. (Those of you that used the donation arrow on Facebook are donating to Peace through PayPal. **Note: PayPal takes 2.9% + \$0.30 per transaction**). **All of these methods work for me.**

If you would like to begin using the Simply Giving option (Note: Simply Giving charges Peace approximately \$8 a month for \$1,200 in donation which is .6%), just ask me for the form and I'll e-mail or mail it to you.

**Please don't send cash through the U.S. Mail.**

God will see us through this crisis and we will be stronger in faith and more able to meet the other challenges of caring for our church, social ministries, and one another.

Keep Peace Lutheran Church's brothers and sisters in Christ in your prayers.





Simply and I mean simply, purchase the cards following worship or order whatever you want for the following week. That's it. 100% of the proceeds will go toward our food pantry in feeding the poor.

We are going to shop no matter what. We might as well serve the Lord in the process. I love the program because it helps me think more about God. I don't always do that when I use my debit or credit card. When I'm out having a meal with family or friends, shopping at the mall with my wife, doing some work around the house, and I go to pay the bill with my Scrip card, I find myself lifting up a word of thanksgiving for being able to enjoy the blessings given by my Creator.

Just like my cancer, the "Pandemic", is a major inconvenience & I'm wondering if you are as "Over It", as I am? This brings me to this piece I am writing for our newsletter - I need an outlet, so bear with me.

"Desperate Times call for Desperate Measures", and feeling desperate some days, I am testing my writing skills before I "TRY" & publish my book "Limping Thru Life & Loving It". Are we in this together? The T.V. tells me we ARE, but do you play: Hide-n-Seek with your cat? Talk to your dog(s) & answer? Do lots of laundry (because there's no shortage of detergent)? Go "In Search of..." TP, HAND SANITIZER, PAPER TOWELS? In spite of all that we ARE TOGETHER in our HOPE & FAITH & we don't have to wear a mask to pray.

My husband, Charlie & I are holding our own & surviving 24-7 togetherness. It helps he works a few days a week & hank Heaven because 24-7 is a lot of space sharing. After 40 years, we've developed our own patterns & they have us stumbling over each other. I'm sure you know or have heard of my 2 Border Collies, Tyler & Reba. Yes, Tyler's the one who loves communion & is now vying for The Blood of Jesus~ wine.. He was by my side when I joined PLC 4-19-19 & I guess he feels entitled. They are taking full advantage of our 24-7 living & have Charlie wrapped around their paws. They love to wake him up at 2 a.m. & he falls for it & out they go. I tried to warn him of their manipulation, but he doesn't listen & I say NOTHING because it actually amuses me & I continue to sleep.

There has been good & inspiring with ISOLATION : EASTER SUNDAY, Pastor Trexler & Sandy are never disappointing & speak sincerely from the heart. We took their communion suggestion & nearly had to call 911. I'm sure it amused the Heavens w/ our paper Black Box Pinot Noir & 2" round Cuban Wafers that could choke a horse & nearly did me in as Charlie insisted we take it all at once. This was where 911 was almost needed as I coughed, & gasped. I darn near chugged the remaining wine, but thought better of it & prayed...crisis averted "Thank you God". Though not the most elegant communion, it was all ours & one we'll never forget. God is Good & I'm certain He understands my quirkiness.

I sincerely hope you are "finding your way" thru this Pandemic with your deep FAITH, HOPE & PRAYERS. May you take heart & find for smiles within your trials.


