

Dear Friends through Christ:

Yesterday I stopped at Cumberland Farms for an ice coffee. Got back in the car and headed home up I-95. It was raining, as it always does this time of year, and I noticed my car windows were fogging up rather quickly. So, I turned on the defog, but it seemed to get worse. I was bummed. This is a brand-new truck. Why can't they seem to make things that work? Then I realized, I still had my mask on, and it was my glasses fogging up and not the windows.

I realize this story does not shine a good light on my mental state, but I am sick and tired of the virus and can't wait until masks are history. However, I am also sick and tired of the political unrest in this country. I have seen relationships between friends and family torn apart over opinions learned through various human stories.

That is why for the month of October, and longer, we are going to be hearing and hopefully listening to a different kind of story. God's story. Our story. We are going to revisit some of the beautiful biblical stories from our youth—Adam and Eve, Cain and Able, The Tower of Babel, Joseph and the Coat of Many Colors, David and Goliath, Daniel and the Lions Den. My hope is that these truth stories will teach us, not only about the nature of a God, who is with us every step of the way, but also our nature, where we resist God's will every step of the way. My prayer is that this ancient holy literature will help each of us to understand that maybe our glasses are a little foggy because of the human stories we listen to. Trust God! Trust Jesus!

During this time, normally the church would focus our worship structure around stewardship—time, talent and treasure. And maybe I should, because two months of closing our doors, and five months of worshipping less than 50% of normal is beginning to take a toll. But right now, I do want to thank everyone who has offered up their time, talent and treasure through this crisis; especially to those who haven't been able to worship the past seven months; especially to those who work in the food pantry to serve those less fortunate; especially to our council and treasurer who continue to meet and prepare for our future; especially those who help take care of all the daily chores at this Lampstand. Thank you and stay safe.

One last thing before I sign off. I can use some help on our community garden. The vision is still a little foggy, but the idea is still wonderful—a garden to sow a little hope and beauty around the church. We have the beds built and enough topsoil, now we just need to fertilize and plant. Once we (somebody smarter than me) figure out how to water, Peace Lutheran will host its first annual Garden Party one Saturday this month. Just bring a shovel, hoe or rack and get dirty. I'll email you the date later when my glasses clear up.

We genuinely miss seeing each other. We are a family.


We are the Peace family... we share our love of the Lord Jesus,

I'm somewhat concerned looking at our finances. Our General Fund was in the red at the end of August. That means when I do payroll, mortgage or other bills, I'm using monies, in the checkbook, designated for reimbursables, youth, etc.

I've been waiting for Pastor David to have a good stewardship sermon and continue to look forward to hearing that sermon. Here is the best Stewardship sermon in a nutshell. A Pastor Blume in Newport News, Virginia in the 1990's testified that he and his wife decided early in their marriage that they would tithe. Pastor Blume mentioned every time they increased their giving something good happened that made up the difference. He put four children through college and led a happy, humble, faithful and blessed life. Lord, if we all had faith like that we would have more than enough money.

## CDC Guidance for Faith Based Organizations

PLC leadership continues to carefully review current Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidance for faith based organizations. We have temporarily stopped the passing the peace, and passing offering plates from our services. There is plenty of space for worshippers to spread out. As we continue to social distance in our sanctuary, here are CDC common prevention tips to help stop the spread of COVID-19 as we worship together:

- **Maintain good hand hygiene, washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.**
- **If soap and water are not readily available, use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, tissues, and no-touch trash cans. (We have hand sanitizer readily available for your use)**
- **Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or use the inside of your elbow. Throw used tissues in a no-touch trash can.**
- **Face coverings are meant to protect other people in case the wearer is unknowingly infected but does not have symptoms. We do encourage for you to wear masks in our sanctuary, please.**
- **Do not place protective masks on anyone who has trouble breathing or is unconscious, or anyone who is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.**

Thanks to all for your dedication to Christ and devotion to PLC!



At the time of this writing, we served 288 households adding up to 942 family members in the month of September and we still had one more Tuesday morning to go. **WOW!!!**

No wonder it seems like we are "hustling" more to get the food gathered, boxed and out the door. Our numbers are growing.

Here are ways that you can help with this ministry....

1. We always need plastic grocery bags. This is an ongoing need.

2. Doing some fall cleaning??? We accept limited donations of small household goods, books, toys, shoes and clean clothing. We don't have storage space, so we offer this on a very small scale each time we are open. The items go quickly.

3. Cash donations are always needed. We pay 20 cents per pound for all of the food we give away. This includes meat. We try to give out 5-10 lbs. of meat to each household per month.

We thank all who donated in September on behalf of our faithful volunteers and the people that we serve. We appreciated the donations of bags, cat food and litter, cash, and food items.




