Dear Friends through Christ:

Merry Christmas! This year we will celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior on Friday, December 24, at 4PM and 7PM. Hope to see you!

Last month, I mentioned that I would try to paint a picture of a vision I see for Peace Lutheran. That vision has been placed into words and given to your council for their input. We will share that vision in the January newsletter.

In the meantime, on January 2, 2022, Peace Lutheran will finally gather together with one worship service at 10:00AM. Mark that down. One worship with full liturgy and choir at 10AM!

On this same date, Sunday morning Bible study will be offered at 8:45AM for all ages. Sandy Trexler will begin teaching the younger generation the basics regarding Word and Sacrament. They will explore Baptism and Communion and hear the classic stories found in the Bible.

The balance of the people willing to invest their time on Sunday morning at 8:45AM will serve as "Guinea Pigs," helping to place the final touches on a book, entitled "It is Enough." The book reveals the heart of our Creator and God's will for humanity. It does this through the bookends of Scripture. It teaches human nature and purpose. It opens understanding to sin and evil in the world. It shows our past, our present, and our future. It gives options and shows the outcome of our choices. It truly is enough.

"It Is Enough" uses the two most exciting and misunderstood books of the Bible, Genesis and Revelation, showing a rational side of truth. These heavenly pieces of literature give wisdom. The introduction to Genesis (up to the call of Abram), and the entire text of Revelation is enough to gain a better knowledge of the balance of Scripture. It is enough to begin to see and understand so many of our depth questions. Who is God? Who am I?

At 9:30AM, the classes will begin to wrap up. At that time those wishing to sing in the choir will gather for practice, while the rest of us can finish our discussion and gather for fellowship and treats. It is exciting to get back to some sense of normalcy. Hope to see you!

Seeing that we are still fighting the effects of this pandemic and seeing that we are trying to move forward at the same time, I would like to wrap up this month's letter with the topic of stewardship. A steward is a person who manages or looks after property belonging to another. We are to manage and look after the property that belongs to God. And folks, it all belongs to God. I promise, when all is said and done, you will not take one single thing with you. You won't need it. We are simply stewards. We become good stewards by offering up a minimum of 10% of your time, your talent and your treasures for work in Christ's Church and God's kingdom. The possibilities are endless.


Can you give your treasure? For so many years, my time seemed to be all used up and I felt my talent was lacking. Therefore, the giving of my treasure always seemed to be the easiest of the three. From the day I received my first paycheck to now, I have made certain that at least 10% is given to charity, and not once did I ever miss a single dime. I believe the Lord, now through experience, when he teaches what a person gives will be given back, pressed down and overflowing. How can you use 10% of your wealth to serve God?

Later this month, you will receive a stewardship packet in the mail. Please take the time to read and pray as to how you will respond. For those who participated last year, in the next few days the "Love Letter to God" you filled out last year will be returned, unopened. Start thinking about where you can best serve in 2022.

If all members of Peace Lutheran became the stewards our Lord expects, we would be absolutely amazed at what happens next.

Reading the "Pastor's Desk" message that precedes my comments, I'm reminded of my time 4-6 years ago on call committee. It took us two years to discern and execute God's will: find a new pastor with vision, energy and determination. One who would lead our congregation during what we anticipated would be a challenging time--we just didn't know how challenging. A pastor who would help shape our church's future.

In March 2020, Pastor David led a half day strategy session attended by our newly elected church council. Its essence: mobilize the resources needed to upgrade our campus, grow our congregation, and boost our community outreach. Volunteer efforts have taken care of many of our initial goals and objectives. We've repainted our buildings and accomplished much of the outdoor lawn/garden work that keeps our campus looking neat and clean. My short definition of a leader, "Someone who knows where we need to go and inspires the rest of us to go there together." So, here we are. Our time is now. Pastor David, mission accepted!!

The Food Pantry ministry at Peace has been reopened since April 2020 under the leadership of Lori Search and help from the hard working volunteers. We stayed open throughout the pandemic and never missed a beat each week. Our numbers keep growing and the financial support from the congregation and donations from the community continues to be faithful.

We could not be as successful as we are without the team of volunteers that pull it all together each Tuesday morning and throughout each week. Pastor Trexler picks up WaWa donations on Thursdays and Jacqui also fills in for him occasionally. Lori's father also helps picking up produce occasionally, when needed. Charlene picks up the Einstein Bagels on Mondays, the WaWa on Fridays and opens on Tuesday mornings. We currently have 10 volunteers who work on Tuesday mornings....and 3 attend Peace.



Lori picks up our dog and cat food in Fellsmere. Most weeks she makes 3 trips to Second Harvest and brings meat, produce and non- perishables to the church. She also volunteers at SH so that we are able to get some of the "best picks". By being proactive she is able to supplement what we spend and gets us so much more to give away.

On December 21st, we will be having a small Christmas celebration as we work. If you would like to honor our hardworking volunteers, you could send a card of thanks or a generic small gift for our "grab and steal" game. Hints....One of our guys takes a bus both ways to come and help.... one loves peanut M&Ms.....a small gas card would be a great surprise. Gift cards are great. We all love cheesecake to share!

Better yet, give an extra Christmas donation in the collection plate marked for the Food Pantry ministry, in honor of our workers.

We continue to thank you for the grocery bags. This is always an ongoing need. Thanks also for your donations.

CDC Guidance for Faith Based Organizations

PLC leadership continues to follow the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidance for faith based organizations. The most recent CDC guidance simply says: **"Infection/transmission is minimal for fully vaccinated people; prevention measures are still recommended for unvaccinated people, including wearing masks, staying 6 feet apart from people who don't live with you, avoiding crowds and washing hands often."**



Most PLC worshippers are fully vaccinated; others are not. We are blessed with plenty of space in our sanctuary for attendees to do what is comfortable for them as far as masking and distancing.

Thanks to all for your dedication to Christ and devotion to PLC!

- **Maintain good hand hygiene, washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.**
- **If soap and water are not readily available, use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, tissues, and no-touch trash cans. (We have hand sanitizer readily available for your use)**
- **Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or use the inside of your elbow. Throw used tissues in a no-touch trash can.**
- **Face coverings are meant to protect other people in case the wearer is unknowingly infected but does not have symptoms.**
- **Do not place protective masks on anyone who has trouble breathing or is unconscious, or anyone who is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.**

Picking Up Panera



If you've ever wondered about all those Panera announcements, here is a quick start guide to signing up! Panera Bread in Hammock Landings at the west end of Palm Bay Road gives away their surplus every night at closing time. For many years now we have been the lucky recipients of their Friday night stash! They close at 9:30PM, so you **must arrive around 8:45PM** and hang out in the store until they are officially closed and ready to give you the bread items. There are big, plastic tubs and produce bags that are usually kept in the Fellowship Hall. Some people take them home with them while they are at church on Sunday. Otherwise, you would need to get up to church during office hours and get the key from Jacqui to pick up the bins and bags. Please make sure the bins are clean before using them. Panera will often give you a large garbage bag full of bread and lots of smaller bags of bread. The pastries are just placed on the counter and you must put them in the flat bin. Ask for a pair of disposable gloves to do this, and of course, you must wear your mask into Panera at the present time.

After receiving the items, you head home, wash up your hands and counters, and proceed with bagging the items, preferably with a mask and gloves on. (Panera will give you extra disposable gloves if you ask for some.) Pre-Covid, we would cut up the pastries for our coffee hour. Nowadays, we are individually wrapping them for people to take home. The bread is bagged and tied in reasonable portions for our food pantry to give away. If you have a key to the Fellowship Hall, you can take the items up to church on Saturday and place them in the freezers in the kitchen. If not, you can bring the items to church on Sunday morning, preferably before the early service. We have been freezing the bread since the food pantry doesn't operate until Tuesday morning. My understanding is that there are no preservatives in Panera bread, and we sure don't want to be handing out stale bread! Please place bread items in freezer and pastries on coffee cart in the Fellowship Hall. You can bring the cart over to the sanctuary.

The amount of items varies greatly from week to week. One time, I got well over 100 bagels. Sometimes there are garbage bags full of French bread. If I feel that there is more bread than we can possibly use, I have often taken the surplus up to CITA, a men's residential facility on US1 south of New Haven. They are always very appreciative. My role in this for many years, has been to try to schedule people and purchase produce bags as needed. It has been increasingly difficult to find people who are able to help with Panera and the same 3 or 4 people are doing it week after week and have been for several years. When these people are unavailable due to travel or other conflicts, I am often making desperate phone calls. There is a sign up poster in the narthex with some instruction sheets next to it. Please make sure to write your phone number on the poster so I can give you a reminder call. I am available to answer any questions. My home phone number is 321-676-3849.

This job requires driving at night, carrying large bins, and a good deal of time to cut, bag, and package items. It is much easier with two people. The benefits are to the food pantry, to your fellow parishioners on Sunday morning, and finally, that you get to make yourself a cup of tea and have a great dessert on Friday night when you are finished!

Please consider giving it a try and seeing if you might become one of our "regulars."




